Service Offshoring and White-Collar Employment [JOB MARKET PAPER]

CESifo Working Paper 2040, 2007 - Submitted to The Review of Economic Studies

Abstract: This paper empirically studies the effects of service offshoring on U.S. white-collar employment, using data for more than one hundred occupations. A model of firms' behavior based on homothetic weak separability allows for tractable derivation of labor demand elasticities to service offshoring for each occupation. Estimation of the model is performed with quasi-maximum likelihood, to account for high degrees of censoring in the employment variable. Results show that service offshoring raises high skilled employment and lowers medium and low skilled employment. Within each skill group, however, service offshoring penalizes tradeable occupations and benefits complex non tradeable occupations.

Offshoring, Multinationals and Labor Market: A Review of the Empirical Literature

Abstract: This paper reviews the existing empirical literature on the effects of offshoring and foreign activities of Multinational Enterprises (MNEs) on the labor markets of developed countries. Available results suggest that material offshoring worsens wage inequality between skilled and unskilled workers; they are instead still too ambiguous to support concerns that material offshoring increases the volatility of unskilled employment and produces adverse short-run employment dynamics. Service offshoring does not significantly reduce total employment, nor does it pose serious threats to human capital accumulation. Finally, foreing activities of MNEs entails a substitution away from domestic labor; the relationship is however weak and mainly driven by horizontal, market-seeking Foreign Direct Investments.

Skill-Biased Effects of Service Offshoring in Western Europe

Abstract: This paper studies the effects of service offshoring on the skill composition of labor demand in Western Europe, using comparable data for nine economies during the 1990s. A short-run translog cost function allows derivation of demand elasticities for three labor inputs. Potential endogeneity and measurement error in service offshoring are accounted for by using instruments based on indexes of telecommunication reform in Eastern Europe. Results show that service offshoring raises relative labor demand for high skilled workers.
